hand massages, for people in the late stages of dementia

Where: A care home in East Twickenham

When: 2 hours once a week.

Why: People with very advanced dementia are often unable to

participate in the normal activities provided by a care home. We want to provide meaningful sensory activities so that people can enjoy quality of life towards the end of their lives.

What does the role

involve:

Undergoing a DBS (criminal record check)

Attending specialised training.

Working with care home staff to give hand massages and

other sensory activities.

Be reliable

Have empathy and patience,

A background in a caring or therapeutic role would be

advantageous.
