

Volunteer Role Description – **Befriending Care Home Residents**

Role: Befriending an older person living in a care home

Where: Across the Isle of Wight in your neighbourhood

When: 1 to 2 hours once a week.

Why: Older people in care homes are potentially some of the most

vulnerable people in our society. Research shows that they are twice as likely to be lonely as older people living in the community.

What does the role

involve:

Undergoing a DBS (criminal record check)

Attending training.

Visiting and befriending an older person living in a care home,

usually once a week for an hour.

This might involve activities such as reading to them, or playing a

game, chatting, or going for a walk.

Attributes / skills

needed:

Be reliable

Have empathy and patience, Be friendly and approachable

Ability to listen and engage in conversation

What's in it for you?

Meeting other like-minded volunteers.

The satisfaction of knowing that you are making a big difference in

the life of a vulnerable person in your community.

Valuable experience of volunteering.

Pre- agreed out of pocket travel expenses.

What you can expect

from us:

Training and induction before the role starts.

Ongoing support from the project co-ordinator and an annual

review.

Regular meetings with other volunteers.
